As the only moderate Democrat in the race, my candidacy strikes the right balance. I champion small businesses, socially liberal policies, open debate, public safety, and education.

1. Public Safety:

Responsible Rhetoric: The "Defund" movement began in D.C. and percolated through to local levels in the form of policy. Our Congressman in D 10 was a part of the "Defund" wave (Westside Rag: 6.7.20). While \$1 Billion was removed from the NYPD budget, including

funding of a crucial homeless outreach team, the worst of it was on a cultural level. The police were DEMORALIZED. They were asked to step back, and the people paid the price. This was never anything my family and I signed up for, yet the consequences are punctuated throughout the city. Good police officers need to be able to do their jobs.

While it's true that members of Congress are responsible for initiatives on the Federal level, their weight in local issues is understated. Jerry Nadler endorsed Alvin Bragg during a period of surging violent crime. I cannot fathom this was done in the best interest of the people, but I do know that creating a "crime sanctuary city" is not the way forward for NY.

I would personally introduce a bill to incentivize high crime cities to reign in violent crime to reasonable benchmark targets to receive certain federal grants. Incentive is the best motivator for behavioral change, and in the face of a negligent prosecutorial context, stricter measures ought to be taken to apply pressure on local levels to protect their citizens. Ultimately, public safety is about quality of life, and it is lacking here in NYC.

2. Small Business Advocacy:

It is imperative that we streamline emergency funds deployment in preparation for potential future crises. As a small business owner, I know that cashflow is key to survival. It keeps employees paid, and benefits fulfilled. Many small businesses would still be in business today if PPP was deployed efficiently, and expediently. I will introduce a bill to improve emergency readiness for the future.

Easier access to credit for small businesses at reasonable interest rates will help growth initiatives and fosters long term prosperity. I plan to be on the congressional Small Business Committee in order to work this bill through. As a small business owner for over a decade, I know what it takes from the inside to create an environment for small shops to succeed in NY. New York City has not made it easy for them, especially the past few years. We need to remember that small businesses are the gems that give neighborhoods character and provide residents a sense of community.

Small businesses deserve tax breaks. As Democrats we must do better to support these important but struggling community mainstays. Small tax breaks will lead to more operating cash flow and greater growth potential. We owe them as much following the enormous sacrifice the small businesses in this city have made for the greater good.

Brian Robinson is a proud Jewish American, father, husband, and man of his community.
